- 1. **Traditional Management and Current Restoration Projects** with an overview with *Ron Reed* from the Karuk tribe. This tour will visit road decommissioning projects on Steinacher Road and Merril Creek Roads with *Earl Crosby*, Karuk tribe; Merril Creek Fish Passage and Riparian Restoration with *Jim Villaponteux*, SRRC, and Forestry, Fire and Fuels—Merrill Mountain and Butler Neighborhood, with story teller *Frank Lake*, Karuk tribe, and the USFS
- 2. Mid-Klamath—Mainstem Thermal Refugia Float with Underwater Video & Fish Identification with *Toz Soto*, Karuk tribe, *Leroy Cyr*, USFS, and *Will Harling*, MKWC. Raft to refugia and restoration areas to learn about refugia use and importance, Salmonid identification, and creek mouth enhancement
- 3. Salmon River Spring Chinook Watershed Education with Petey Brucker and Nat Pennington, SRRC, in Forks of Salmon focusing on Spring Chinook background, community approach to restoration, education as a tool for restoration, and featuring a Salmon River Snorkel Tour

Directions to the Forks of Salmon from I-5 North

Follow I-5 to Yreka, Take the CA-3 Exit 773 toward Fort Jones / Etna. Turn right onto CA-3. Follow through Scott Valley (passing Fort Jones and Etna.) Take Etna Pass over and follow Sawyers Bar Rd (approx. 35 miles to Forks of Salmon School). The Forks of Salmon School will be on your left after a sharp turn near the Forks of Salmon Post Office.

Directions to the Forks of Salmon from 101 North

Follow US-101 N / Redwood Hwy. Merge onto CA-299 E via Exit 716A toward Weaverville / Redding. Turn left onto CA-96 / Bigfoot Scenic Hwy. (in Willow Creek.) Continue to follow CA-96 for 44.3 miles, past Hoopa, Weitchpec, and Orleans. Turn right onto Salmon River Rd. and follow to the Forks of Salmon (16.9 miles.) You will see the Forks of Salmon Community Club on the left and the Forks school will be on your right.

Logistics: The cost of the event includes workshops, the symposium, camping, and food. Come prepared: Please bring layers of clothes, sunscreen, a sun hat, and sneakers or boots, and river sandles, and a wetsuit, snorkel & mask if you plan to dive. For camping you will need a tent, sleeping pad & bag, flashlight, insect repellent, and you may want to bring a camping chair.

If you prefer not to camp, a great lodging option is Sandy Bar Ranch on the Klamath River which is 30 minutes from Forks of Salmon, (530)627-3379 or www.sandybar.com
