## To Our Valued Supporters,

I am writing on behalf of Salmonid Restoration Federation to encourage you to become an exhibitor at the 33<sup>rd</sup> Annual Salmonid Restoration Conference, which will be held in Santa Rosa, CA from March 11-14, 2015. Exhibitor spaces at the Annual Salmonid Restoration Conference are \$3,000. Included in this fee are four (4) days of exhibitor space and three (3) conference passes.

Salmonid Restoration Federation (SRF) is a non-profit organization that promotes stewardship, sustainable management, and restoration of California's salmon, steelhead, and trout populations and their habitat. We provide critical educational services for California's community-based salmonid restoration organizations and agencies by producing an annual conference, field schools, and workshops. SRF's statewide conference on salmonid restoration provides an opportunity for field tours, technical workshops, panels, and a plenary session on the state of salmonid recovery in California.

The first two days of the conference will included full-day workshops and field tours. A half-day plenary session will be followed by 1.5 days of technical, biological, and policy-related concurrent sessions. Workshops will include: an Aquatics Invasives Species Workshop, California Coastal Monitoring Program: Monitoring Central Coast Coho Salmon Populations, Fish Passage and Protection: Taking a Watershed Approach, Captive Broodstock Symposium & Warm Springs Hatchery Tour, and Innovative Trans-Boundary Approaches to Coho Salmon Recovery. Field tours will include: Bio-Engineering and Floodplain Restoration on the Russian and Napa Rivers, Large Wood and Off-Channel Habitat Projects in Western Sonoma, Lagunitas Creek Watershed: Stem to Stern Salmon Enhancement, Improving Summer Streamflows in Coho Streams Tour, Redwood Creek and Muir Beach Restoration Projects, and a Dry Creek Habitat Enhancement Project Tour.
