




From the Coast (Eureka/Arcata): Take Exit 716A to merge onto the CA-299. In Weaverville turn left onto CA-3 N/Trinity Lake Blvd all the way to Yreka. In Yreka, turn right onto Oberlin Rd Turn. In 0.2 mi turn right onto Comstock Dr and then a quick right onto Yellowhammer St. Turn left onto Kahtishraam. The destination is on the right.

From I-5: Take Exit 775 towards Central Yreka. Turn right onto W Center St/E Miner St. In 0.1 mi, turn left onto S Main St, continue 1.1 mi, and take onto Oberlin Rd. In 0.2 mi turn right onto Comstock Dr and then a quick right onto Yellowhammer St. Turn left onto Kahtishraam. The destination is on the right.
