



Black Oak Ranch Water Conservation— Flow Enhancement in the South Fork Eel River

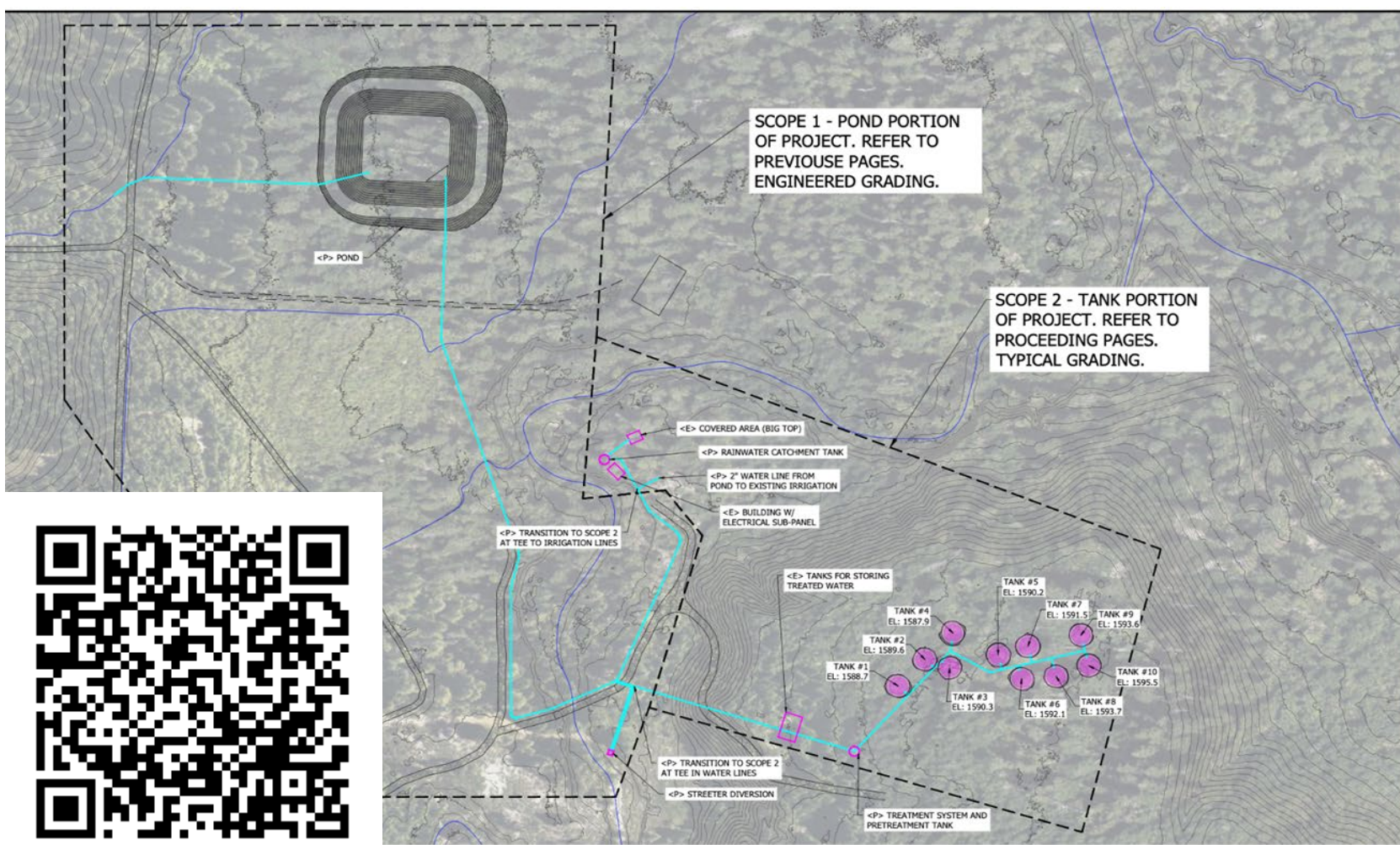


Salmonid Restoration Federation is thrilled to partner with the iconic Black Oak Ranch in Laytonville, California to build five-million gallons of water storage on Black Oak Ranch that will allow the Ranch to store water during the winter season for use in the dry summer months. Black Oak Ranch hosts Camp Winnarainbow, the Women’s Herbal Symposium, music festivals, and is home to Irene’s Garden.



The Black Oak Ranch Water Conservation Project will:

- Provide needed water storage capacity and allow forbearance from dry-season water diversions
- Enhance summer flow conditions and improve water quality for salmonids in Tenmile and Streeter Creeks
- Improve water reliability and water security
