Job Title: Streamflow Monitoring and Project Assistant

Supervisor: Executive Director

Compensation: Depending on Experience

Terms: 20-30 hours per week

Specific Duties:

1. Assist Project Coordinator with Streamflow Monitoring (40% of time)

- a. Field work averages two days a week in Southern Humboldt and Mendocino County. Field work often extends outside of standard business hours and requires overnight travel / camping
- b. Follow protocol to measure streamflow using a velocity meter or manual method
- c. Record detailed field notes including qualitative observations of stream and fisheries conditions
- d. Enter data into spreadsheets and review for quality control
- e. Manage field equipment and data loggers
- f. Assist with project development tasks necessary for new restoration and ecological monitoring projects, including preparation of grant proposals and grant reporting
- g. Assist with project assessment including data analysis, preparation of tables and graphs and report writing

2. Administrative Duties (30%)

- a. Assist with office and systems management including the CRM, website and other non-profit platforms that SRF utilizes
- b. Assist with data entry and producing sales receipts for educational event registrants
- c. Maintain file systems for tracking subcontractor invoicing and payments
- d. Staff the SRF office and fill merchandise orders
- e. Maintain paper and electronic files and systems
- f. Maintain and update required forms, permits, event applications, etc.
- g. Update CMS website as needed
- h. Help maintain office systems and equipment

3. Possible additional field work (15% of time)

- a. Assist science consultants with biological snorkel surveys
- b. Deploy temperature loggers in ponds
- c. Measure groundwater
- d. Assist science consultants with topographic surveys
- e. Assist science consultants with stream assessments or stream habitat surveys

- 4. Outreach and Education (15%)
 - a. Outreach about streamflow conditions including social media posts
 - b. Contact landowners about access
 - c. Grassroots fundraising and donation solicitation
 - d. Assist with research and development of educational materials
 - e. Distribute promotional materials and conduct targeted outreach
 - f. Help maintain and improve the SRF website and informational resources

Required Qualifications:

- Familiarity with the salmonid restoration field
- Experience in research and monitoring of riparian habitats
- Minimum of a B.A./B.S. or equivalent experience
- Ability to adapt to changing work priorities and deadlines
- Ability to multi-task and maintain a professional demeanor
- Willingness to have a flexible schedule and travel periodically
- Highly proficient with Microsoft Office Suite: Word, PowerPoint, and especially Excel
- Excellent writing and editing skills
- Excellent public relations and verbal communication skills
- Very detail-oriented and meticulous
- Able to work in the SRF office in Eureka
- Have a valid CA Drivers License
- Able to lift up to 50lbs
- Able to walk on slippery and uneven terrain.
